Memorial Day Observance 1979

Perry honored its veterans of all wars on Monday with a parade and ceremonies at two cenotaphs.

The parade, the largest held here in years, moved in a light rain, along the flag-lined Main St., up Mill St. and S. Center St. to the Veterans Memorial Building on Lake St.

The joint venture of the V.F.W. Post 5009 and American Legion Post 350 of Perry featured a V.F.W. patriotic float depicting Arlington Cemetery, to honor the dead of all wars.

A salute to the dead was fired and taps were sounded as the parade paused in mid-Main St.


Music for marching and remembering was by the Perry Central Yellow Jacket Marching Band, led by their director, Donald Hughes and James Bigchalaney.
